





MGVPC initially has to focus on its teaching and learning competency and gradually transform itself into a research focused university building on the current competency around teaching and learning.

Actions

- NEP has put lot of focus on skill development among the student community. Mahatma
 Gandhi Vidyamandir's Pharmacy College (MGVPC) would like to have the students
 develop key competencies like Leadership, Teamwork, Communication Skill, Social
 Sensitivity etc. It believes that these skills are developed in students by encouraging them to
 participate in various extra-curricular events and inter-collegiate competitions.
- We will Increase faculty engagement with students aimed at augmenting the students' lifetransforming experience and favoring the development of their abilities, skills, and competencies through the effective mentoring program. We will invest in training our faculty members to become excellent mentors for our students thereby enriching the student's life at MGVPC.
- MGVPC commit to continue and strengthen efforts to innovate the teaching model, enhancing the use of interactive methodologies, tools, and technologies aimed at improving the learning process of students. At least 50% of the pedagogy will be through studentcentric learning methodologies.

We will ensure that MGV PC have a best faculty-student ratio between 1: 12 to 1:15.
- Recruit Faculty with Ph.D. over the next five years and encourage existing faculty members
 who do not have Ph.D. to complete their doctoral degree. The goal is to have more than 80%
 faculty members having their doctoral degree by 2027. MGVPC needs to strengthen its
 PhD centre to develop a resource pool and also its research capabilities.
- Encourage faculty, students, and staff to use the strength of technology to enhance the
 teaching and learning process. MGV PC already is using ERP and LMS for delivering the
 course resources and educational processes. We will try to enhance the effectiveness and
 robustness of the existing technology.
- Faculty enrichment programs like FDP, trainings in industry, ATAL-FDP,MOOC is a game-changer in the delivery of education. All faculty shall be made to train in this arena.
- We want all departments to have a robust list of Graduate Attributes/Program Outcomes
 for their students. These attributes should be used to derive the learning outcomes of various
 courses and each department should map these Learning Outcomes to courses so that at the
 end of the program, all learning outcomes are effectively embedded in the various
 courses.
- Other skills that can be nurtured in students include-Conduct of skill based certificate courses., participation in ODL courses for gaining credits.
- Up-gradation of laboratory facilities.andPre-placement training in soft skills are also required

Actions

- Create Research Budget (target >1 Crore) by 2027 for the resources needed for encouraging and conducting research. A research committee constituted at the highest level would oversee research fund allocations.

- Each department would strive to recruit and retain faculty with research aptitude and create
 a system of mentorship for faculty members who are in their initial stages of research.
- MGV PC would like to make research and publication to be one of the priorities of the faculty
 members. This would include research and publication as one of the key result areas of the performance
 management system. NEP also focus on inter-disciplinary research among the faculty
 members.MGV PC should be creating a platform for nurturing inter-disciplinary research work.

- The department would be encouraged to introduce research-based pedagogy like a
 dissertation, research projects to the students so that they can be converted into research and

 giving funding to the institutions. We will encourage the faculty members to get funding for

- MGVPC would encourage the faculty members who are doctorate to enroll themselves as research guides at affiliated universities.




