Report on

4th National Pharmacovigilance Week 2024

Event Overview:

The 4th National Pharmacovigilance Week 2024 was celebrated from September 17 to September 23 at MGV's Pharmacy College, Nashik under the aegis of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). This year's theme, "Building ADR Culture for Patient Safety," emphasized the critical importance of monitoring and reporting Adverse Drug Reactions (ADR) to ensure patient safety. The week featured a variety of engaging activities and competitions designed to enhance awareness among students from various programs, including D Pharm, B Pharm, M Pharm, and Pharm D. The event was conducted under the guidance of Principal Dr. S. R. Tambe and Vice Principal (Pharm D) Dr. R. A. Patil.

Day 1: Welcome and Inauguration (September 18, 2024)

Objective: To formally inaugurate the week and emphasize the significance of pharmacovigilance.

The event commenced with a warm welcome by Dr. Satyarthi and Dr. B.S. Jagdale, who highlighted the role of pharmacovigilance in improving healthcare outcomes. They set a positive tone for the week, encouraging students from D Pharm, B Pharm, M Pharm, and Pharm D programs to actively participate. Following the inauguration, a **Poster Competition** on the topic of ADR Reporting was held, inaugurated by Dr. Anupama Konure and Dr. Satyarthi. A total of 25 students participated, showcasing their creativity and understanding of ADR reporting through informative posters. Day 2: Workshop and Article Writing Competition (September 19, 2024)

Objective: To provide hands-on training in ADR reporting and foster written communication skills.

An engaging **Workshop** led by Dr. Gaurav Memane, Clinical Pharmacist, Sahyadri Hospital, Nashik focused on the technical aspects of ADR reporting. Students had the opportunity to fill out ADR forms accurately, gaining invaluable practical knowledge essential for their future careers. Later in the day, a **Youth Parliament** was held, where 30 students from different programs actively participated in discussions about pressing healthcare issues, with a focus on ADR reporting. Day 4: Quiz Competition and Fun Games (September 21, 2024)
